The Drug Endangered Children Tracking System (DECSYS) offers local law enforcement and child welfare agencies an automated process for quickly identifying children at risk that is predictable, reliable, and measurable. Developed by the Colorado Alliance for Drug Endangered Children (CODEC), DECSYS is:

A web based system—

Requiring only internet access and an authorized username/password.

Easy-to-use-

This system is simple for both law enforcement officers and child welfare caseworkers to learn and utilize.

Less than 5 minutes-

With less than a day of training, which CODEC brings to your agency, individual cases can be entered into the system, helping you to save children.

Five thousand cases have been entered into DECSYS over the past four years. With the support of the USDOJ COPS office, the DECSYS program has expanded to multiple states.

Children whose parents abuse alcohol or drugs are 3X more likely to be verbally, physically, or sexually abused and 4X more likely to be neglected.

Over a four year span, with data reporting from three different DECSYS states, 69% of children identified were not present at the scene of the arrest. These children were identified later by participating agencies after they were notified by DECSYS of the arrest. In these cases, without the immediate presence of

children at the arrest, law enforcement would not have alerted child welfare to the potential risks in these homes. The DECSYS program collaboration between law enforcement and child welfare has brought three thousand drug endangered children to the attention of child welfare for appropriate assessment.

With an easily accessible and automated system, law enforcement and child welfare agencies will build stronger cases, better engage families, and help many children who would have previously gone undetected.
